**Rislone URC Sprint Series invades Central Pennsylvania on Valley Forge INC Night. . . .
TREVOR LEWIS WINS ONE FOR URC, POCKETS \$3,500 IN JACK GUNN
MEMORIAL SATURDAY NIGHT AT SELINGSGROVE SPEEDWAY**

In the three previous Jack Gunn Memorial URC/358 Challenge events, URC was unable to find the Selingsgrove victory lane, that is until tonight. Trevor Lewis of Upper Black Eddy, PA brought the fans to their feet with a last turn pass for the lead to with the 4th Annual URC/358 Jack Gunn Memorial Saturday night at the Selingsgrove Speedway. The win was worth \$3,500 and it was the first Rislone URC Sprint Series win of the season for Trevor Lewis and the Scott McClaren owned sprint car. For Lewis, it was his thirteenth career URC win after taking the lead from Pat Cannon off the fourth turn for the run to the checker flag.

A field of fifty-four sprint cars took part in the event, with thirty cars representing URC and twenty-four Selingsgrove 358 sprints making up the field. Five heat race events were presented with victories going to Pat Cannon, Scott Flammer, Matt Heimbach, Chris Coyle and Phil Walter. Ryan Kissinger and Michael Carber won the two "C" Main events with the "B" Main win going to T.J. Stutts.

The thirty lap feature will marred with several red flags during the first half of the race that eliminated top drivers like Curt Michael, Matt Heimbach, Scott Flammer, Colby Womer and T.J. Stutts. After a rough start, Trevor Lewis established himself as the man to beat early in the race, beating Blane Heimbach to the lead. A fast and closing Pat Cannon was on a charge and moved into second on lap four. Lewis maintained a solid lead as Cannon, Heimbach, Rory Janney and Jason Shultz.

As the halfway point of the race approached, Cannon was closing on Lewis with the help of lapped traffic. On lap thirteen, Cannon made a bid for the lead, using the low line to slip under Lewis. A caution flag on lap fourteen for Kyle Purks, slowed the field and on the restart, Lewis had a clear track ahead.

With the second half of the race now underway, Lewis once again held a comfortable lead. Cannon and Heimbach followed in second and third with Rorry Janney and Andy Best now making up the top five. The "Wild Child" Josh Weller now moved into the picture, taking over the fifth spot on lap sixteen.

The finish of this race was going to be a crowd pleaser and on lap twenty-four, the excitement began to build. With slower traffic now just ahead of the leaders, Pat Cannon took the opportunity to not only close in on Lewis, but he made a challenge for the lead. Lewis and Cannon were now in a dogfight battle with Lewis up high and Cannon on the bottom of the speedway.

Lewis took the white flag and heading into turn one, Cannon made an inside pass and took the lead. Down the backstretch, Cannon appeared to have solid command of the top spot. Even entering turn three Cannon had command. As the leaders charged out of turn four, Cannon took the high lane as Lewis had a strong run on the bottom off the corner. With the checker flag waiving, Lewis caught Cannon and won by a front bumper at the checker flag.

Lewis was the proud winner with Cannon turning in a thrilling ride as well for second. Blane Heimbach was third with URC's Rory Janney fourth and Nate Snyder fifth. Making up the top ten were Josh Weller, Chris Coyle, Andy Best, Nick Schlauch Jr. and Kramer Williamson.
